Scotland is part of the United Kingdom, and there are four countries that make up the United Kingdom: Scotland, England, Northern Ireland and Wales. Now, Scotland has two main seas: it has the North Sea and the Atlantic Ocean. There are two main cities in Scotland: Edinburgh and Glasgow. Edinburgh is on the east coast and Glasgow is on the west coast.

Another famous thing about Scotland is the Loch Ness monster, where people do not know if it is a true monster living in the loch, or if it is just a hoax, something made up by tourists and people that love round there to gain a recognition for the country.

Scotland is also very cold, especially in the winter, when you have to wrap up very warmly in things such as gloves, boots, scarf and a hat.

Also Scotland has lots of small islands off its coast, where it's even colder. There is also- in Edinburgh, which is the capital city, there is a castle which sits on an extinct volcano, a volcano that doesn't work any more. The castle is quite famous. Lots of tourists come to see the castle every year. And in Edinburgh every summer there is also the Edinburgh Festival, where lots of cinemas, theatres, comedy shows, book fairs get put on.
